Ann Delaware gathers information for books on Bradley

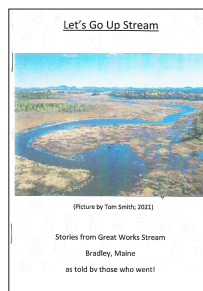
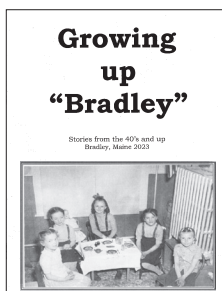

Both booklets are available at the Bradley Town Office at a cost of \$2 each.

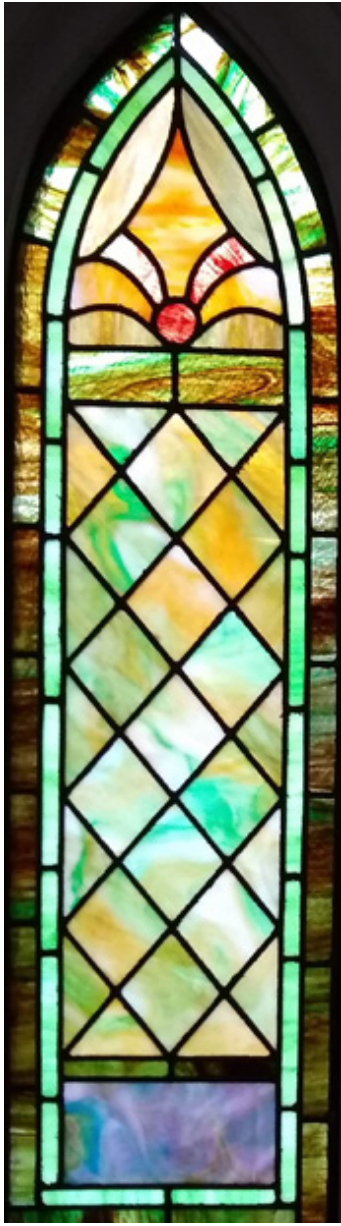
Doing these booklets was an amazing experience for me and I shall always remember it as a true blessing.
